

**Dr. Jo-ann Archibald – Associate Dean for Indigenous Education, Faculty of Education, UBC**

Jo-ann Archibald, Q'um Q'um xiiem, from the Sto:lo Nation in south-western British Columbia, is the Associate Dean for Indigenous Education and professor in the UBC Faculty of Education. Jo-ann received a Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) degree from the University of British Columbia, a Master of Education (M.Ed.) degree and Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) degree from Simon Fraser University. In 2000, she received a Canadian national education award from the National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation. She is the author of "Indigenous Storywork: Educating the Heart, Mind, Body, and Spirit."

**Riccardo Ciccarelli – Undergraduate Student, Faculty of Engineering, Dalhousie University**
